Senators say partisan newsletters OK

It seems a <u>story I broke on Monday on senators' partisan mailings</u> has caused a bit of a fuss and has landed chair of the Senate's committee on internal economy, budgets and administration.

After reading the committee minutes, which are posted approximately twice yearly, I discovered the senator partisan when it comes to their newsletters.

Senators are not allowed to send highly partisan mailings. According to the Senate's administrative rules:

- 7. (2) No Senator shall request the copying or printing of material by the Senate that
- (a) is unrelated to the Senator's parliamentary functions;
- (b) is in a form that is contrary to Senate official language policies;
- (c) is an entire parliamentary publication, available elsewhere in substantially the same form;
- (d) is illegal or defamatory; or
- (e) is partisan because it is on party letterhead or includes a party logo, is a party publication, anno meeting or convention or invites persons to attend such a meeting or convention, solicits a party n 05-06]
