Re: Application for Access – TCHSCP 328.14

On January 31, 2014 Tourism, Culture, Heritage, Sport and Consumer Protection received your request for access to the following records:

"...Please provide documentation on any emails, memos, notices or other documentation provided to FIPPA coordinators (and assistants) noting the need to ensure confidential information is blacked out or removed completely. The time frame for documents being sought is from August 1, 2013 to the present."

Please be advised that during the time period cited, the department's Information and Privacy Policy Secretariat (IPPS) did not send out emails, memos or notices about the need to ensure confidential information is blacked out or removed completely.

In keeping with Section 12 (1) of *The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*, we therefore advise that access is denied because records containing the information that you have requested do not exist.

Contents of response

- 12 (1) in a response under Section 11, the head of a public body shall inform the applicant
- (a) whether access to the record or part of the record is granted or refused;
- (c) if access to the record or part of the record is refused,
- (i) in the case of a record that does not exist or cannot be located, that the record does not exist or cannot be located.

While no responsive records exist, we would note that the Secretariat did stress the importance of document severing and ensuring it was effective at a monthly FIPPA coordinators meeting which took place during the time period cited. The Secretariat also followed its normal practice of providing direction on severing during one-on-one training for new access coordinators, which took place during this period.



Subsection 59(1) of *The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* provides that you may make a complaint to the Manitoba Ombudsman about this decision. You have 60 days from the receipt of this letter to make a complaint on the prescribed form to:
