Re: Application for Access under <u>The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act</u> (FIPPA) - (Our File No. 22-10)

Your FIPPA application to Manitoba Finance was received on March 8, 2010 and seeks access to the following records:

"Please provide documentation on the portion of the "levy for health and education" which comes from the private sector and the portion that comes from the public sector. If possible, please provide a breakdown of public sector contributors to the levy."

Manitoba Finance is pleased to grant your information request in part. Private sector contributions to the Health and Post Secondary Education Tax Levy (HET) account for approximately 55 per cent of the \$357 million raised in the 2008/09 fiscal year, and the public sector accounts for the remainder.

With respect to providing a breakdown of public sector contributors to the HET, Manitoba Finance is prohibited from releasing this type of information because it could reasonably be expected to identify a taxpayer, in contravention of mandatory taxpayer confidentiality provisions found in section 18(2) of FIPPA and section 6(1) of the Tax Administration and Miscellaneous Taxes Act.



Subsection 59(1) of FIPPA states that you may make a complaint about this decision respecting your request for access to the Manitoba Ombudsman. You have 60 days from the receipt of this letter to make a complaint on the prescribed form to:
