Re: Application for Access under <u>The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act</u> (FIPPA) – (Our File No. 122-13)

Your FIPPA application was received by Manitoba Finance on October 22, 2013 and seeks access to the following records:

"Please provide copies of applications approved under the 2011 'Excess Moisture Economic Stimulus Program."

This request was transferred from the Manitoba Agriculture, Food and Rural Initiatives to Manitoba Finance as per section 16(1) of FIPPA as flood program expenditures are disbursed from *Appropriation 27 – Emergency Expenditure*, under the control of Manitoba Finance.

In our conversation on November 18, 2013 you amended your FIPPA request to narrow the scope to: "provide the applicant name, project name, amount paid for the project and a descriptive summary of the project for the 2011 Excess Moisture Economic Stimulus Program".

You were advised on November 21, 2013 that Manitoba Finance was taking a 30-day extension until December 20, 2013 to complete your request, as provided by section 15(1)(b) of FIPPA.

Manitoba Finance is pleased to grant your request in full. Please find attached a spread sheet that lists the applicant name, approved project, total amount paid for the project and a descriptive



project summary.

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## Relevant provisions of The Freedom of Information & Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA)

## Extending the time limit for responding

- 15(1) The head of a public body may extend the time for responding to a request for up to an additional 30 days, or for a longer period if the Ombudsman agrees, if
  - (b) a large number of records is requested or must be searched, and responding within the time period set out in section 11 would interfere unreasonably with the operations of the public body;
