Methodology



Method

Canadian online survey via Leger's LEO panel, with n=1533 Canadian residents aged 18+, including 413 Quebec residents.

When

The weekly online omnibus was in field from the 25th to 27th of July 2025, inclusive, using Leger's online panel, LEO.

Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size (n=1533) yields a margin of error no greater than $\pm 2.5\%$, (19 times out of 20)


Detailed Results






Nearly half (49%) Canadians and three-in-five Quebecers (62%) believe the Governor General's budget should be reduced.

Demographically, men and younger Canadians aged 18–54 are more likely to support an increase, while older Canadians aged 55+ are significantly more likely to favour a reduction. Regionally, Ontario residents (15% vs. 7% in Alberta) are more likely to support an increase.





Among Quebecers, those aged 55 and over are more likely than younger groups to say that the Governor General's budget should be reduced.
