Methodology

-  An online survey.
-  1003 Ontarians 18+ who are eligible to vote.
-  Completed between Sept 22-24, 2023, using Leger's online panel.
-  No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (i.e. a web panel in this case).
For comparative purposes, though, a probability sample of 1003 respondents would have a margin of error of $\pm 3.1\%$, 19 times out of 20.

Leger's online panel

Leger's online panel has more than 400,000 members nationally and has a retention rate of 90%.

Quality control



DETAILED RESULTS

Three quarters of Ontarians believe the gas tax relief should continue into 2024.

75% of Ontarians want the gas tax relief to continue into 2024. Ontarians aged 55+ are more likely to say yes than those aged 18-34. Those who live in Southern Ontario are more likely to agree that the tax relief should continue to 2024 than those living in the GTA (81% vs 70%). Moreover, those living in rural areas are also more likely to agree that the tax relief should continue, compared to those living in urban areas (83% vs. 72%). Younger people (18-34) and women are more likely to say they don't know if it should be extended.



Q1 Last year the Ontario government temporarily reduced the provincial gas tax by about 6.4 cents per litre. This gas tax reduction is set to end December 31, 2023.
