1: I would support expanding disclosure. If we're going to have disclosure of assets in Winnipeg, it would be pointless if there wasn't disclosure elsewhere. Partial disclosure is of little value and could be misleading.

2: Yes, otherwise how could anyone be satisfied that the administration's refusal is reasonable unless there is an appeal process?

3: If there is to be any capping, it should be based on a composite formula based on inflation plus assessment values, because assessment values change too.

4: I certainly concur that there has been a very generous expenditure on large centralised, heroic-scale amenities such as stadia and new museums, etc. This does not mean, however, that I would be positively inclined to freeze realistic support of community-based infrastructure, such as support for amateur sport at community clubs.

5: This current round of inflation occurring is certainly not wage-led, it is led by the drastic surge in executive compensation and, in particular, in the higher end of executive compensation whose increases are statistically a phenomenon of the age. The issue you raise certainly cannot be rationally addressed without taking this into consideration. I certainly look forward to discussing this further with

your organisation.
