Methodology



Method

Online survey via Leger's LEO panel, with n=1008 Quebecers aged 18+.

When

The weekly online omnibus was in field from the 6th to the 8th of March 2026, inclusive, using Leger's online panel, LEO.

Margin of error

For comparison purposes, a probability sample of this size (n=1008) yields a margin of error no greater than $\pm 3.1\%$, (19 times out of 20).

Detailed Results



More than two-thirds of Quebecers oppose MNAs receiving another pay increase.

In contrast, 18% support a salary increase and 14% are unsure. Opposition is strongest among Quebecers aged 35 and older, while men are more likely to express support. Regionally, attitudes are broadly consistent across the province.

Among those with an opinion, eight-in-ten oppose MNAs receiving another pay raise.

Over half of Quebecers strongly oppose and a quarter somewhat oppose the measure. In contrast, only two-in-ten support the salary increase. Quebecers aged 35+ are more likely to *strongly* oppose, while younger Quebecers aged 18-34 are comparatively more open to an increase. Additionally, men are more likely to support a raise, whereas women are more inclined to oppose it.
